the pressurized type, he said. The certification would enable Cascade to increase its current payroll of 90-100 employees with a

payroll of \$928,000 a year.

"We would be able to put more people here, both in maintenance and flight crews, and give the community more cash flow with the cer-

tification," Chestnutt said. The certification sought by Cascade would be similar to that of major airlines of the nation, with modifications to fit its size of operations and its aircraft, he said.

Cascade started its committer-type operations in Walla Walla in November 1971 with 20-30 people on

the payroll. "We can't operate any longer as a

commuter," Chestnutt said. "We need the certification because of increasing passenger loads.

"Through November, there has been an increase of more than 60 percent in passengers over 1976,"
